The Study of Teacher Education Programs: Preliminary Overview:

Presenter: Dr. Martin Orland, Director of the Center for Behavioral & Social Sciences, National Academy of Science. Dr. Orland provided an overview of the workings of the National Academy of Sciences emphasizing the rigor and independence of the consensus committee work with a special focus on the planned study of teacher education. The Future of HEA, IDEA, and OSEP Research Division

Chair: Dean Richard Schwab University of Connecticut

Presenter: Dr. Jane West, Washington Partners, LLC (Education and Public Policy). Dr. West provided an overview of the reauthorization of the Higher Education Act and IDEA and their implications for educational policy. Some of the key issues of IDEA to special education teacher education include:

- Highly qualified teachers in special education with content expertise;
- ♦ Becoming a special education via testing only
- definition of learning disabilities;
- ♦ multi year IEP;
- pre-referral program/early intervention;
- research moved to IES out of Office of Special Education Programs (\$78M) with new center on educational research

Some of the key issues related to the Higher Education Act for universities include:

- ♦ Access does student aid give universities the entitlement to raise tuition
- Affordability what is the relationship between cost to provide education and tuition costs; state cutbacks
- Accountability NCLB goes to college? Rate of graduation, rate of achieving certifications and licenses, (see ACE website for further information about objections from higher education community); learning outcomes associated with college graduation
