- Lame Duck: extending tax cuts, don't ask don't tell, appropriations
- CR ends December 3
- No matter what election outcome: spending freeze or cuts or reshuffling likely
- Miller and Duncan: expect ESEA
 reauthorization early in 2011; staff
 negotiating going on for 2 years; bill close to
 ready on House side

Vision for Role for Teacher Preparation in Higher Education Obama Blue Print

- not articulated in the blueprint
- eliminate the two funding streams to higher education: Teacher Quality Partnership Grants in HEOA (\$43 million) and 2.5% set aside for higher education in Title II of ESEA (about \$75 million)
- change by competing with other providers
- no focus on clinical

Policy Issue: Highly Qualified

- 9th Circuit Court of Appeals in Renee V. Duncan: those in alternate routes are not "highly qualified" – NCLB regulation violates law
- Initial impact: distribute interns equitable
- AACTE and AASCU Brief supporting plaintiffs;
 TFA and New Teacher Project filed amicus supporting NCLB regulation
- Department not happy next step would be to have full 9th Circuit review
- Will fuel the fire during reauthorization



Policy Issue: Highly Qualified

Relationship to "highly effective"

• Hierarchy: highly qualified, effective, highly effective

Tie to preparation program



Policy Issue: Effective Teacher Preparation Program

- Label programs based on test scores of graduates' students and other measures
- Sec. of Education determines which programs are effective?
- Only effective programs eligible for federal funds
- Graduates of effective programs may have Highly qualified or Effective designation; others would not
- Consolidation and competition with alternate routes



Policy Issue: State Data Systems

 ARRA funds: all states committed to data systems that tie program graduates to student test scores

State Policy Environments

- Alternate routes fueled by Race to the Top
- Decouple Masters from pay scale
- Lower standards "flexibility" e.g. Mississippi Task Force may recommend eliminating all higher education secondary teacher preparation and exclusively using alternate routes for certification

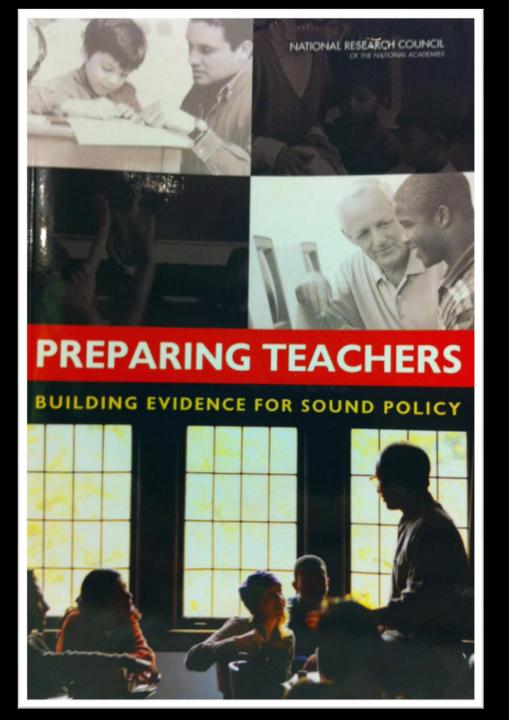

Preparing Teachers Building Evidence for Sound Policy

"The distinctions among pathways and programs are not clear-cut and there is more variation within the "traditional" and "alternative" categories than there is between these categories. We found no evidence that any one pathway into teaching is the best way to attract and prepare desirable candidates...."



The NRC Report cont...

- Need research on relationships between characteristics of teachers' preparation and students' learning – content knowledge, field experience, quality of candidates
- Need comprehensive coherent system for collecting data about teacher preparation



Accountability and Accreditation – NRC Report Conclusions and Recommendations

- Accountability systems for teacher preparation are haphazard and little known about the effectiveness of major elements: certification, testing, program approval and accreditation
- Research recommended to develop valid means of establishing links between teachers' preparation and outcomes for students that could be used in accountability policies for preparation programs.
- Recommended that Department the Education sponsor independent evaluation for teacher education approval and accreditation processes
- States should hold ALL preparation programs to the same standards
- Accountability should focus on performance assessments, not paper and pencil tests
