

US Department of Education

- Presidential Teaching Fellows Proposal
 - Eliminate TEACH grants; state grant program for programs rated highly.

- ESEA Reauthorization
 - Merge multiple preparation programs into a large competition; e.g. Teacher Quality Partnership Grants, Transition to Teaching, principal preparation



Negotiated Rulemaking on Teacher Preparation

 36 negotiators met for 3 sessions from January -April 2012

No consensus

Awaiting proposed regulations



Negotiated Rulemaking (cont'd)

- Rate every teacher prep program on a 1-4 scale
- Effectiveness measures:
 - Value-added K-12 student test scores
 - Candidate and principal satisfaction surveys
 - Employment outcomes
 - Professional accreditation or state approval considering clinical, rigor of selection and content and pedagogical skills of candidate
- Only top-rated programs eligible for student financial aid (TEACH Grants)
- New precedent: state is arbiter of eligibility for student financial aid



Negotiated Rulemaking (cont'd) Concerns

- Unproven and invalid measures of program effectiveness
- Unworkable/lack of capacity
- Overreach beyond Congress and state authority
- New regulatory burden on states and institutions without funding
- Disproportionate impact on minority-serving institutions and programs targeted to high need K-12 students


Operation Educate the Educators

edTPA: Usage Plan

A tiered-membership edTPA Usage Plan for the 2012-2013 academic year has been developed to assist preparation programs as they move forward to full implementation. Tiers include:

Introductory

 Provides initial exposure to edTPA and an introduction to the educative benefits of edTPA for continuous program improvement for up to six months.

Exploratory

• Supports hands-on use of edTPA materials by teacher education programs for up to two years.

Scaling Up

 Offers full access to edTPA materials and official scoring of candidate portfolios for teacher education programs through usage credits to defer the cost of a limited number of candidate fees. Available for institutions or states selected on the basis of criteria developed by Stanford, AACTE, and Pearson.

Implementation

• Provides full access to edTPA materials and scoring of candidate portfolios at candidate expense to fulfill a required component for licensure or program completion, or program review.

Commission on Accreditation for Educator Preparation (CAEP)

- Merger underway
- Commission on Standards and Performance Reporting – 5 working groups and 41 members
- Draft standards out for public comment early 2013
- Final standards late 2013
- 2 year transition period through 2015
- Spring 2016 earliest CAEP standards would be required






