## **COVID Vaccines Available** for Young Children

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that everyone ages 6 months and older get vaccinated against coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). As such, CDC and the Ohio Department of Jobs and Family Services has shared resources for parents, vaccine providers, and partners. A website for parents and caregivers includes information on COVID-19 vaccination for children and adolescents and Nationwide Children's Hospital offers further vaccination information as well as a link to schedule vaccination appointments at the main campus.

## Ohio Summer Food Service Program:

#### Kids Eat Free and No Registration

All children ages 1 through 18 are eligible to receive free meals during the summer months at participating program sites. Individuals ages 19 through 21 who have been identified as having mental or physical disabilities and are following Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) through their current enrollment in educational programs also are eligible for free summer meals. Meals are served locally at Thompson Rec Center and Milo-Grogan Boys & Girls Club.

# ASR's Couple and Family Therapy Intern


